So far, we have lost 213 members and gained only 140 new members for a net growth of -73 members. With Mission 1.5 as a dedicated effort throughout Lions International to increase our overall membership to 1.5 million members and serve over 1 billion people, we need to work hard to

bring in new members.

I am challenging all clubs in MD18 to bring in at least one new member by December 31, 2023. How do we do that? "Just Ask!" If all 182 clubs in MD18 achieved one new member, there would be no membership problem. Our MD18 GMT Coordinator PDG Len Cutuli and GMA Champion PDG Willie Cooper are eager to support districts in increasing membership by focusing on rejuvenating the district with new clubs, revitalizing clubs with new members, and re-motivating members with new and exciting service. 

Lions Clubs – Best Practices for Financial Transparency

From the Lions International document: Integrity and transparency are at the very heart of a Lions club. Sound and clear communication is critical to achieve this goal. The club should outline in the club constitution and by-laws that the board of directors should receive the club's financial report no less than monthly and the original bank statement on a regular basis. Care should be taken to ensure that the bank statement and the financial report balance.



The Financial Report should include:

- 1. Opening Balance The balance that was reported during the previous meeting. The report should include the amount in each account.
- 2. All income Note the amount and source of the income. Fundraising events should include an itemized report outlining the money received and each expense paid. Every significant expense requires an invoice sent or receipt and the income should be validated by attendance, ticket sales, or some other quantifiable means. The club may establish a definition of the amount requiring a receipt.
- 3. All Expenditures All payments made which were approved by the board of directors. It should be noted that all payments must be approved by the club's board. Sometimes the expense payment approval is included in the club's budget approval process or by separate formal resolutions. Either way, the approval requires a quorum and must be reflected in the minutes. Receipts and invoices received should be obtained to verify the amount spent.
- 4. Ending Balance The final amount is provided, which will be the opening amount the following month.

October Global Service Team Information

From GST Report by Lion Doreen Stallworth

What is Reportable Service Activity (RSA)? There are two types of RSA:

- Direct Lions and Leos plan and implement a service project to serve community needs and interact directly with the people being served.
- Indirect When Lions serve but do not interact directly with beneficiaries.

In MyLion, you can measure the impact of your service activity/project by reporting the following metrics:

- Number of people served (adults and youth)
- Number of volunteers who participated (Lions, Leos, and non-members)
- Number of volunteer hours spent in planning, fundraising, and implementing the activity or project.
- Additional metrics to report environment and community improvement service activities.

To effectively tell our story, measure our impact, and grow membership, it's critical that all clubs report service. Every project we participate in as Lions and Leos, no matter how big or small, is valuable in our journey of serving our communities and the world.

Per the Georgia Lions Camp's Constitution: Article III Officers, Section 1. Annual Election of Officers (d):

A member of a Lions Club in Multiple District 18 desiring to become a candidate for the office of chair, vice chair, secretary, or treasurer of the Board of Directors shall be required to submit a Letter of Intent stating their desire to become such a candidate. Such Letter of Intent shall include their qualifications for the office they are seeking and include a statement from the Secretary of their home Lions Club attesting that they are a member in good standing and that the club has endorsed their candidacy. Such letter must be received by the Chair of the Nominations Committee by no later than December 1st.

All offices have one-year term limits and therefore are up for election. If you are interested in running for the board or serving on a committee, I encourage you to let us know!

Our Environmental Cause – It's The Little Things

According to a Facebook Post that I've seen a couple of times, there's a lady who buys "vintage casserole dishes when she sees them at thrift stores or yard sales and uses them when she brings a meal to someone!" The recipient has the choice of keeping the dish or reusing it in the same manner.

It is a great idea to buy reusable dishes at thrift stores and yard sales and not just for delivering meals to others. So many people forget about reusing goods as an environmentally friendly thing to do.

I urge you to seriously consider donating to and shopping at places like Goodwill, the Habitat Restore, and other thrift shops – not just for cookware but for clothing, shoes, furniture, decorative items, etc. Another great way to reuse is to join your local "Buy Nothing" group on Facebook.



Speaking of reuse – I have a tip for you if you are collecting medicine bottles for **Matthew 25 Ministries**. After you've washed the bottles in very hot water and there's just a little stubborn sticky stuff left, try using a soap pad such as Brillo to scrub off the residue. Believe it or not, it doesn't hurt the bottles.

And, more reuse – Don't throw away old LEGOs! The company has a new service called LEGO Replay. They will wash, sort, and donate the old bricks to charities that work with children. They will even cover the shipping costs. Per the lego.com website, "LEGO Replay wants to inspire LEGO brick owners to pass along the bricks they aren't using. Play has the power to change children's lives. When children play, they learn how to problem-solve, collaborate, and think creatively. The State Awards Committee encourages everyone to apply for the Council of Governors State Awards in each of these three areas:

- 1. Awards for the most Service Hours supporting the Five Global Initiatives
- 2. Awards for best physical or digital Scrapbooks documenting the activities of your club
- 3. Awards for the best marketing of your club on Social Media

Service hours posted in the MyLion section of https://www.lionsclubs.org between July 1, 2023, and April 15, 2024, will be considered when granting the awards. Scrapbooks must be submitted by April 15, 2024. Social Media sites will be monitored between when the awards committee is notified of your club's desire to be considered and April 15, 2024.

The Information Technology Committee recommends that clubs avail themselves of Artificial Intelligence tools to help them with their club planning. There are many tools now available on the Internet, but one of the largest of these is ChatGPT and it is free for your use (a paid option with more features is also available, but the free version works great!)

You can download the app to your smartphone or computer and type in a question like, "Design me a program to attract new members to my local Lions Club." ChatGPT will instantly give you a detailed program to do just that. You can fine-tune answers with follow-up requests like, "Refine the program to make it more attractive to young business professionals."

Other suggestions where ChatGPT can help you design club programs are:

- "Create a plan for a fundraiser for my Lions Club that involves the sale of food,"
- "Design a plan for discovering the needs in our community that our Lions Club could help meet with a service project,"
- "How can I, as the Lions Club President, motivate my members to ask others to join our club?"

You will be surprised at how thorough and insightful the answers can be, and it's free!

Another free Artificial Intelligence tool is Google Bard. It is very insightful. Use both tools and compare the answers!

From the Georgia Lions Lighthouse Foundation Bylaws regarding Board elections:

Article IV Officers

Section 1. Officers

All officers of the Lions Lighthouse must be Lions in good standing of a Lions Club in Georgia at the time of their election, and at all times while serving on the Board.

A. The Chief Volunteer of the Lions Lighthouse shall be the Chair of the Board ("Chair"). The Chair must have served on the Board of Directors within the last five (5) years before standing for election. The Chair shall be the driving force in setting the policies for the Lions Lighthouse.

B. The Vice Chair must have served on the Board within the last five (5) years prior to being elected. In the event the Chair is not able to perform his or her duties, the Vice Chair will assume the role on a temporary basis. The Vice Chair shall perform such duties as assigned by the Chair.

C. The Secretary is responsible for recording and documenting the actions of the Board, will serve as the custodian of all corporate documents, and such other duties assigned by the Chair.

D. The Treasurer shall chair the Finance and Audit Committee, oversee the finances of the Lions Lighthouse, present for approval the annual budget, and perform such other duties as assigned by the Chair.

Section 2. Election of Officers

A. The annual election of officers shall be conducted during the first calendar quarter of each year at the Annual Georgia Lions Lighthouse Foundation Volunteer Meeting. The date and location for this meeting shall be set by the Board at least 30 days in advance with proper notice of the meeting being provided. The Board shall determine whether the meeting shall be held in person, virtually or in a hybrid format and shall set forth applicable attendance requirements in the meeting notice.

B. Each chartered club in good standing in Lions Clubs International shall be entitled at the annual election of officers for the Georgia Lions Lighthouse Foundation Board of Directors to designate one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members of such club who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club, as shown by the records of Lions Clubs International on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the election is held. Each delegate (or alternate, as applicable) shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote only for each officer position to be filled by and one (1) vote only on each question submitted to the respective convention. The affirmative vote of a majority of the delegates voting on any question shall be declared as decisive and be reviewed and affirmed by the Board. All eligible delegates must be members in good standing of a club in good standing in this district and properly registered, whether attending in person or virtually, for the meeting.

C. By December 1st of each year, any Georgia Lion who meets the qualifications for the office being sought may run for a Lions Lighthouse officer position and shall submit to the Immediate Past Chair (or designee) and Governance Committee Chair for eligibility vetting a letter of intent to stand for election. Said letter must be countersigned by the president of the candidate's home Lions Club certifying the club's endorsement of the candidate. In the event that no candidate submits a letter for a position, a nomination may be accepted from the floor, provided that the nominated person is a Lion in good standing from a Georgia Lions Club.

D. The Immediate Past Chair (or designee appointed by the Board Chair if the Immediate Past Chair is unable to preside over the election) shall preside over the election portion of the meeting, provided he or she is not standing for election. In the event of contested elections, each candidate will be allowed four minutes to speak to the delegates. Only the candidate will be allowed to speak. In the event of only one qualified candidate for an office, a vote by acclamation is in order. To prevail in an election, the winning candidate must receive 50% of

A. The Officers shall each serve a one-year term that begins on July 1st of each year and ends on June 30th of the following year. This will also act as the fiscal year for the Corporation.

C. A vacancy in any office may be filled by the Board or any committee or officer to whom authority has been delegated by resolution of the Board.
