Wow! What another busy month September has been! I attended the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Reno, Nevada, September 21-23 along with other Lions from MD18. We had a great time! We attended interesting seminars on a vast array of topics ranging from "Club President – Skills to Succeed" to "Becoming an International Director." We attended general sessions with outstanding motivational speakers, including International

President Dr. Patti Hill, and participated in great service projects. The USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum allows you to get up close and personal with Executive Officers and the staff of Lions International and ask the questions on your mind. We took away many great ideas as well as a renewed enthusiasm and energy to enhance the service, membership and leadership in our clubs, districts, and multi-district. I hope more Lions in MD18 will attend the forums in the future. The next USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum will be in Louisville, Kentucky September 5-7, 2024.

There is a lot of hard work going on all over the state on membership with our Global Action Team (GAT) support of Mission 1.5. Mission 1.5 is a dedicated effort throughout Lions International to increase our overall membership to 1.5 million members and serve over 1 billion people by June 2027. Our MD18 GMT PDG Len Cutuli and GMA Champion PDG Willie Cooper are supporting the districts to help increase membership by focusing on rejuvenating the district with new clubs, revitalizing clubs with new members, and re-motivating members with new and exciting service. In September, MD18 received an LCI Membership Grant of \$4500 to help with membership growth. I am confident our districts will be able to utilize these funds to increase their membership in the months ahead.

I want to encourage all Lions, especially those wanting to assume greater positions of leadership, or to learn more about Lionism in Georgia, to attend the Grace Clower Georgia Lions Leadership Retreat on January 5-7, 2024. This year's Leadership Retreat will be held at the Georgia Lions Camp in Waycross, Georgia and the registration fee is only \$75.00. There are scholarships available from the Past District Governors (PDG) Associations to cover the cost of the registration fee. Apply with your District PDG Association first, before applying to the Multi-District Association. Scholarships are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis. This is a great opportunity to join fellow Lions for a weekend full of learning opportunities focusing on growing as a Lion leader in Georgia. Help your club's membership be revitalized, your service impact to grow, and your members to see greater leadership opportunities." MD18 Awards:

- **Global Causes Awards.** These awards recognize the service of clubs in our five global initiatives which include Diabetes, Vision, Hunger, Environment, and Childhood Cancer. First and second-place awards will be given to the clubs, <u>that report their service on MyLion</u>, and have the most service hours in each of the initiatives between July 1, 2023, and April 15, 2024. **To qualify, you must log your club's service hours!**
- Scrapbook Awards are available to clubs that use scrapbooks, physical or digital, to document their club's activities for the year.
- **Social Media Awards** are available to clubs making the best use of social media including Facebook, YouTube, X, Instagram, etc. Let your community know how you serve their needs. To be entered, notify the First Vice District Governor in your district that you want your social media site to be monitored.

Bronze Pin - US\$50 to US\$99.99. Silver Pin - US\$100 to US\$199.99. Gold Pin - US\$200 and above Leo-Presidential LCIF Supporter - Minimum donation of US\$20



If you're making your contribution online and your one-time donation amount meets the eligibility criteria as noted in the levels of recognition, remember to select "Yes" in the third step titled "Who is the donor?" This ensures that your pin request is acknowledged. If you choose alternative methods to contribute to LCIF, kindly reach out to us at donorassistance@lionsclubs.org to initiate your pin request.

The recognition awards are granted annually, upon completion of the respective donation levels per year. This ensures that your dedication and support are promptly acknowledged and celebrated.

Presidential Club Giving Award for LCIF

The Presidential Club Giving Award for LCIF is awarded to clubs based on their donation **per-member average** during the fiscal year.



Bronze Level - US\$50 per member (within a fiscal year) Silver Level - US\$100 per member (within a fiscal year) Gold Level - US\$250 per member (within a fiscal year) Platinum Level - US\$500 per member (within a fiscal year) Diamond Level - US\$1,000 per member (within a fiscal year)

These awards are banner patches.

The recognition awards are given annually, shortly after the close of the fiscal year. This ensures that your club's dedication and support throughout the year are acknowledged and celebrated appropriately. Once your club's contribution is documented and verified, the prestigious award will be processed and automatically dispatched to you.

- Unless you want to make lots of extra effort for yourselves, you should reject any bottles that still have labels or glue. If the labels and glue won't come off easily, these bottles should be added to your recycling bins. →

News on The Lion Portal

A message from Sue Ben, Chief of Technology, Lions International:

We are continuing to make progress toward the new Lion Portal, which will provide a streamlined digital experience for Lions and Leos. We are grateful to the dedicated Lion testers who have played a critical role in providing input at every phase of the project, and this includes helping assess our readiness for launch.



Our top priority is ensuring our members have a positive experience with the new Lion Portal. With that priority in mind, we have determined that we need to adjust our projected Q1 launch. Lion testers are key to our success and their testing activities have been delayed to correct an unexpected permission and data access issue.

We have carefully assessed the remaining scope of work and necessary changes to support the resolution passed at the 105th International Convention in Boston to determine the revised target launch date. Our next launch opportunity is January 2024. This incorporates the new rules for delegate count and allows midyear membership changes to be processed in a familiar system.

Thank you for your continued support and leadership as we prepare for the new Lion Portal.



Childhood Cancer Grant Program for Districts/MDs



Each year, more than 300,000 children are diagnosed with cancer. Improving childhood cancer survival requires supporting children and their families while they experience the unimaginable social, economic, and emotional burdens of having a child with cancer. What could you and your district do to help these children and their families? What if you had a grant from LCIF?

Grants are available to Lions districts and multiple districts in amounts from \$10,000 to \$150,000. Projects must be implemented in coordination or collaboration with existing government or charitable childhood cancer medical facilities.

The Childhood Cancer grant program will not fund medical care directly. If an applicant wishes to implement a project involving medical equipment or infrastructure, they may be eligible to apply for support though the <u>LCIF Matching grant program</u>.

Childhood Cancer project examples include but are not limited to:

- Construction, expansion, or renovation of child, teenager, and family-friendly waiting rooms in healthcare facilities
- Construction, expansion, or renovation of rooms or houses where families can rest, sleep, or cook meals while their child is receiving treatment
- Projects that strengthen access to or improve transportation to and from medical appointments
- Projects that address the educational and recreational needs of childhood cancer patients receiving treatment at a healthcare facility
- Infrastructure to support palliative care



Outstanding State Awards Program

The MD18 Council of Governors State Award Committee is happy to announce the criteria for all awards granted during the 2023-2024 term. Please make the responsible parties in your club aware of the following qualification criteria and encourage them to apply for a COG State Award.

- 1. Service Hours may be turned in for service projects in the following LCI categories:
 - a. Diabetes
 - b. Vision
 - c. Hunger
 - d. The Environment
 - e. Childhood Cancer
- It is not necessary to submit a club's service hours to the State Awards Committee. The Committee will use the service hours posted to MyLion for service projects conducted between July 1, 2023, and April 15, 2024.
- Service hours for a club will be divided by the number of club members to allow for all clubs to be treated equally based on relative service per member. There will be a winner and a runner up for each category.
- 4. The fact that we will be relying upon your posting your service hours to MyLion means it is very important for your club to correctly and promptly enter all service projects and the hours associated with those hours into MyLion. Club Secretaries as well as the new Global Service Chair may enter your service project hours.
- The winning club will be allowed to decide whether they would like for their financial reward to go to the Georgia Lions Camp, Georgia Lions Lighthouse Foundation, Leader Dogs/SE Guide Dogs, Learning Ally, and LCIF.

Scrapbook Awards

Scrapbooks can provide a wonderful history of the activities of a Lions Club. It can afford members of tomorrow to see what members in the past did to serve their communities. It can also provide a rich history of the members and their role in supporting their Lions Club. The State Awards Committee encourages all Lions Clubs to put together a scrapbook documenting this Lions' year.

There are awards given for both electronic and physical scrapbooks. It is up to the creator's imagination as to what events will be shown and how it will be presented; however, at a minimum, the scrapbook should present a written and pictorial history about Club events during the fiscal year being judged. Examples of content are photos, programs, and news clippings from installations, inductions, special presentations, service projects, fundraising events, and visits to district meetings or multi-district meetings.

- 1. A single scrapbook may only be presented in one of the two formats: digital or bound.
- Scrapbooks must bear the Club's name on the opening slide for digital format or on the opening page for a bound format.
- A USB Flash Drive is the preferred format for submitting digital scrapbooks to the State Awards Committee. The USB Flash Drive must be submitted on the first day of the 2024 Multi-District Convention. The size of the scrapbook is limited to 1GB.
- The digital scrapbook entry may be submitted in one of the following formats: PowerPoint, a website dedicated to the scrapbook, a digital scrapbook program such as Smile box, Shutterfly, etc.
- Scrapbooks will be judged on how well their presentation reflects what the club is doing. Be sure to date and label the scrapbook entries. It is suggested that the club include pictures and captions that tell a story about the club. Include personal touches to tell the club story. Use your imagination.
- 6. Consideration will be given for content, organization, originality, creativity, and neatness.

Social media is such a vital communication tool today. It is one of the most important ways of reaching new prospective Lions. To further this goal, we have added an award category for the club with the best use of social media for the purpose of communicating and promoting Lionism to grow their club, their District, and Lions in general, and to show their community how they serve.

Here are the guidelines for submission followed by the judging criteria:

Clubs may only submit one of the following social media platforms for judging by the State Awards Committee:

- 1. Facebook
- 2. YouTube
- 3. X (Formerly Twitter)
- 4. Threads
- 5. Instagram

Submissions will be made by notifying the member of the State Awards Committee that represents the club's district that the club would like for them to begin monitoring the clubs' postings to the social media platform of their choosing. The district committee members are:

District L - 1st Vice District Governor Wes Gifford

District I - 1st Vice District Governor Rita Harris

District O - 1st Vice District Governor Christy Wray

District N - 1st Vice District Governor Larry Griggers

Social media accounts will be judged on the following:

- Following and connecting with other community organizations, leaders, and the public to spread the word about their club.
- 2. Sharing photos of their recent activities to show the world how they're serving the community.
- Keeping current members updated and informed about upcoming projects, meetings, and events.
- 4. Attracting new members.
- Staying up to date with Lions Clubs International news and programs by encouraging others to follow LCI's social media accounts.

Judging will begin as soon as the State Awards Committee members are notified of the social media page to be monitored. It will end April 15, 2024.
